## BOARD AND AGENCY REFERENCE AND DIRECTORY CITY OF NEW LONDON, CONNECTICUT MAY 2024 REVISION

The City of New London has a long history of service to the community by active and diverse resident citizens, who make up the membership of the various City boards, agencies, commissions, committees, zones and authorities that go under the generic term "board" or "agency."

## Appointing Authority

The majority of appointments to boards and agencies are made according to regulations found within the City Charter or Code of Ordinances. The municipal directory section includes names, addresses, appointing authority, political party registration, enabling legislation and term of appointment.

Appointments of residents are made either by the Mayor (Chief Executive Officer) or the City Council. Some appointments made by the Mayor require City Council approval.

The enabling Charter or Ordinance regulation may make reference to the "Mayor" or "Chief Executive Officer." If the authority originates by charter, the title of "Mayor" is used. The Code of Ordinances has designated the term "Chief Executive Officer" replacing "City Manager" by employing a specific blanket ordinance.

A few ordinances created prior to 2011 refer to "Mayor", the title previously held by the council elected chair, now known as Council President. Any reference to "Mayor" prior to 2011 was intended to designate the present position of "Council President."

A few boards were established by state legislative acts, plans or non-ordinance resolutions by council. The establishing authority is noted following the board or agency title. An example is the Parking Commission which was created by a Connecticut State Legislative Act in 1951. In 2015 the City Council passed an ordinance creating a Parking Authority.

## Residency

Charter Sec. 45 requires that "any person appointed to a board or commission of the City must be a resident of the city." In some cases an appointment is based upon a designated position and the person found a resident of another town. By strict interpretation that person does not qualify for membership. For example: Union President or Police Chaplain may be specified as a member. However, membership remains subject to the Charter residency provision of Sec. 45 and elector's party affiliation is determined by voter registration records lacking any other reliable method to prove residency. We are also determined to satisfy any stated municipal minority party representation goals. The only area that appears to have flexibility is in those few boards and agencies that specify that a member may "designate" someone to act on their behalf. In those infrequent and temporary situations where the person is so designated, the City residency requirement may not be applicable. Individual situations should be referred to the Director of Law.

Residency is presently established by enrollment as an elector. In fact, the ordinance language of some Boards and Agencies require that the member be an "elector." The Personnel Board states in Sec. 2-38 (B) that the appointee be an "elector of the City" which differs from the Charter requirement that the person only be a "resident." This subject is under review by the Charter Review Board.

## Commitment and Attendance Policy

It is expected that everyone appointed to a commission or an agency understand that with their appointment comes the commitment to attend regular meetings, unless excused by the chair. Members should review attendance requirements with the board or agency chair. Administration guidelines since 1984 have suggested that no member should miss three consecutive meetings or fail to attend sixty percent of regular meetings during a twelve month period. It is the responsibility of the chair to report any member who fails to meet the standards of attendance.

## Experience

While not a predictor of a person's ability to be a valued member of a board or agency, it is advantageous to the success of both the agency and the appointee that the member brings some experience to the board or agency. If you have an interest in a specific agency, you are encouraged to sit in at these public meetings to see if you might want to make an application to be considered as a member.

## How membership is selected

Citizens with an interest in serving on a board or agency should complete the Board and Agency application found on the City website. Completed applications are forwarded to the appointing authority after confirmation of name, address and party affiliation from voter registration records by the City Clerk. Signed applications acknowledge that the applicant agrees to the responsibilities as required by the New London Code of Ethics (Code Sec. 15-214) and are retained in the board or agency core file. The entire text of the Code of Ethics appears in the Code of Ordinances, beginning in Sec. 15-201.

## Minority Political Party Representation

The City of New London takes care to ensure that board and agency membership reflects political fairness standards in the ratio of party affiliations. In some instances this political ratio is specifically stated in the ordinance that created the board or agency.

## Membership of City Staff or Political Liaison on Boards and Agencies

Some staff members are stipulated by the board and agency ordinance as liaison or technical advisors to municipal boards and agencies. Specific concerns should be referred to the Director of Law.

## Term

Appointments may be for set terms or to fill in the remaining term of a previous appointee. Appointment terms are often staggered on newly created boards. Once the board is established, standard terms generally begin on the appointment date. Occasionally, a term will expire and the incumbent continues to attend meetings. If a reappointment is made before a term ends, unless otherwise designated, a new term begins at the time of reappointment for a term length stipulated
by the appointing authority or ordinance. Members with expired terms who wish to be considered for reappointment should fill out a board application and submit it to the City Clerk to signal to the appointing authority that you wish to have your term renewed.

In 1997, City Director of Law Londregan stated the following:
"As a general rule when appointed ... a person serves until a replacement is appointed ... even if their initial term has expired. The reason for this rule is to avoid the inconvenience to the public that would result if a position was left vacant so that the board or agency would not be hampered in obtaining a quorum to lawfully conduct business."

## Role of the Chair

Knowledge of Robert's Rules or previous experience in attending or conducting meetings is helpful. Many meetings are conducted under an informal version of Robert's Rules. The chair arranges for meeting space, calls meetings, sets agendas and regulates discussion to maintain order. It is incumbent on the chair to be aware of the terms of members and the need to fill potential vacancies. The appointing authority must be advised of vacancies, potential vacancies or term questions, as they become known. It is also important to keep the editor of the agency directory informed of vacancies.

## Role of the Secretary

Organizations need a minimum of two officers to conduct a meeting efficiently: the Chair and the secretary. The secretary is expected to work closely with the chair to ensure records are maintained and reflect the business of the meeting in accordance with Freedom of Information Statutes. Minutes may be taken in the form of notes or electronic transcription for later publication. Agendas and minutes should be posted on the City website by City staff associated with the City agency.

Code Sec. 2-14 (b) Holds the secretary of the board or agency "responsible for supplying the City Clerk and ... public library with copies of major studies, reports and minutes." However, it is recommended that the secretary of the board or agency inquire if the public library actually wishes to receive the materials as their retention procedures often differ from state distribution guidelines.
C.G.S. Sec. 7-110 - Official publications of the city shall be kept in the state library for reference. The City Clerk shall send to the State Library two copies of each tangible publication as soon as the publications are published. The City Clerk shall, upon publication, supply the State Library with, or notify the State Library, of the existence, availability, and location of any intangible publications of the City.
C.G.S. Sec. 1-210 requires that the public records pertaining to such agency shall be maintained and available to the public or municipal government staff. Board and agency chairs or secretaries must send agendas and approved minutes to the City Clerk for required posting, filing and retention programs as required by the Freedom of Information Act.

Archived Board and Agency agendas and minutes are retained by the City Clerk and may eventually be destroyed in accordance with regulations mandated and promulgated by the State Public Records Administrator under the discretion of the Connecticut State Librarian.

## Appointment Notification

The City Council and/or the Mayor make appointments. Council appointees will receive a letter of appointment providing the date of appointment and term. The Mayor's staff makes notification of Mayoral appointments.

Posting Notices and Agendas - Meeting Space
It is a requirement of the State of Connecticut Freedom of Information Commission that citizens be provided with proper notice of all public meetings. Each year, by January 1, all boards and agencies are required to file with the City Clerk a calendar of their regular meeting schedule for the year ensuing which is posted and maintained in the City Clerk's office.

The agenda of each of the regular meetings of every public agency shall be available to the public and shall be filed not less than twenty-four hours before the meetings to which they refer, (1) in such agency's regular office or place of business, and (2) in the office of the City Clerk. Special meetings may be called with only twenty-four hours advance notice. Notice of the date, time, place and purpose must be included.

## Determining Posting Time

C.G.S. Sec. 1-225(g) - In determining the time within which or by when a notice, agenda, record of votes or minutes of a special meeting or an emergency special meeting are required to be filed under this section, Saturdays, Sundays, legal holidays and any day on which the office of the agency, the Secretary of the State or the clerk of the applicable political subdivision or the clerk of each municipal member of any multi-town district or agency, as the case may be, is closed, shall be excluded.

## Board and Agency Directory Section

The Board and Agency Directory is maintained by the City Council Administrative Assistant and is updated approximately monthly.
