1) Please advise if the bid due date could be extended until January 20, 2017.

NL to respond: Bid due date has been extended to Thursday January 19, 2017 at 2:00pm

2) Please provide the project specific prevailing wage rates.

NL to respond: See wage schedules at the end of questions.

3) The invitation for bid, (IFB), item #13 notes the requirement for 25% set aside of the state funded amount of the contract. Please provide the state funded portion of the contract that would be subject to the 25% set aside requirement.

NL to respond: Not applicable. Please disregard.

4) Please confirm if Owners Protective Liability and Property insurance is required to be provided by the contractor.

NL to respond: Owners protective liability and property insurance is not required of the contractor. The city will maintain property coverage.

5) Please confirm if Professional Liability, (Errors and Omissions), insurance is required to be provided by the contractor.

NL to respond: Professional liability is required for architects and engineers so is not required by the contractor for this bid.

6) Contract for Services item #9 indicates that appropriation of funds for this contract will be made on a fiscal year basis. Please confirm if the entire project will be funded for all fiscal years.

NL to respond: Yes, confirmed

7) Please confirm the requirement for the contractor to perform all required professional structural engineering design services required for this project.

As required for shop drawings, calculations and structural allowance work

8) Please advise on the method for the contractor to include an allowance for the furnishing and installation of all structural items required on the project which are currently not designed.

Allowance will be on a Time and Materials Basis

8) Please confirm the requirements and extent of any contractor responsibility for performing hazardous materials testing.

As stated in the documents "The existing building materials contain lead and asbestos materials. Lead and asbestos testing results have been provided to contractors.

All HAZMAT abatement is the Contractor's responsibility. The Contractor shall comply with all current regulations per all/any agencies having jurisdiction in the proper testing, removal and disposal of all/any asbestos and lead containing materials as part of the Base Bid." Please provide the necessary specifications for asbestos and lead paint abatement.

10) Specification section 01010-6, 1.6, A, indicates allowance amounts "to complete the proper roofing installation". Please confirm the requirement to replace the existing roof.

The existing roof will not be replaced. Disregard this statement

- 11) Specification section 01010-6, 1.6, A, Please verify if allowance items #1 thru #5 are intended to cover ALL of the work required of that particular trade which is currently reflected in the project design drawings or is the contractor to carry a base bid number for each particular trade and the allowance amounts are for unanticipated work above and beyond the work currently reflected on the drawings.

The specifications note to figure 25% of all joints will require repoints and the scope of the masonry repairs are indicated on the elevation drawings

26) Note 16 A-102, A-103 & A-104 - restore/repair marble steps: unable to quantify

Quantities to be based on a visual review of the existing conditions

27) Note 17 A-102, A-103 & A-104 - restore marble floor: unable to quantify

Quantity to be based on a visual review of the existing floor conditions

28) Designations SRE01, SCP01, SDP01, SPA01 & SMC01 - need quantities of each repair

The work to be performed is shown on the elevation drawings. Quantities to be determined from the drawings except for repointing which is 25% of all joints

29) Note 7 elevation drawings - water repellent/consolidant coating: no material specification provided or limits of application shown - scope not identified in any of the work summaries either.

Water repellent/consolidant coating not required - eliminate reference

30) Note 9 & 10 L-001.0 - need quantities

To be based on a visual review of the existing conditions

31) L-001.0 refers to blow ups on A-112 & A-206 - the drawings are labeled A-112.0 & A-206.0 and do not provide the blow ups noted on L-001.0

Drawing A-206 contains the referenced elevation of the fire escape. The blowup indicated as being on A-112 is actually on A-501

32) Specification section 01330-9, 2.2, C and D, Please confirm the contractor requirements for any BIM or REVIT drawings.

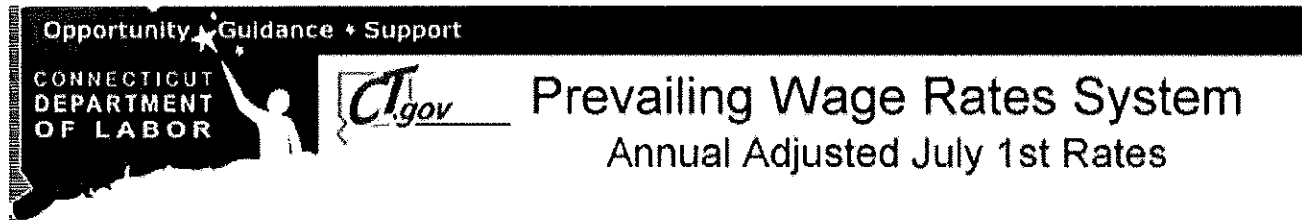

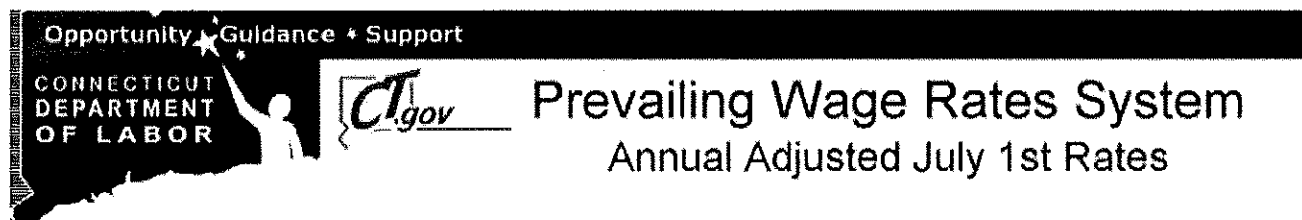
